REMOTE EDUCATION EXPECTATIONS

- Revised expectations published 7 January
- provide teaching that is equivalent in length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school. This will include both recorded or live direct teaching time and time for pupils to complete tasks independently
- Minimum:
 - Key Stage 1: 3 hours a day on average, less for younger children
 - Key Stage 2: 4 hours a day
 - Key Stages 3 and 4: 5 hours a day
- publish information for pupils, parents and carers on the school's website by 25 January 2021



OFSTED FROM JANUARY 2021

Change of plan announced 12 January:

- Remote inspections from 25 January to February half-term
- No grades
- Schools graded inadequate or requires improvement*
- Focus on how well children and learners are being educated remotely
- Follow up on complaints raised by parents across all grades of school in order to resolve issues
- As remote, unable to cover the full scope of a monitoring inspection
- Details of the inspection process to be published shortly

*Schools that have been judged RI on two or more occasions are the focus however single RI schools may also be selected
